

have been known to exceed 100 mm, usually in juveniles with recent release from the 500 net trap in otherwise, this fish reached an astounding 100 cm and has and goes to over 100 cm in length. Brown trout are very catholic in what they eat, feeding on a wide variety of bait fish and large fish and other smaller trout species. Many populations of brown trout have adapted well to their surroundings and environment, and have created high quality forms native to the wild brown trout fisheries throughout their range. In addition to the many varieties of indigenous brown trout throughout Europe the popular game fish has found its way into other suitable habitats around the globe. Basically wherever Europeans colonized they took their brown trout with them from New Zealand, Tasmania, South Africa, Chile, Argentina and several are some of the main introductions where the brown trout has become the prime game fish. There are numerous freshwater or sea-run brown trout both in their native waters as well as newly established ranges that are raised. Much of the loss and gains that this fish has brought to areas has produced its significance as a well established fish well adapted to its new world surroundings. I personally live and fish the white river fisheries that regularly produce trophy sized specimens many of which are sold and distributed. My dream is to one day catch one of trophy size to put in my own trophy room and treasure the beautiful specimen.
