

brook trout was designated as the official state fish in 1994.

It is a beautifully colored fish with yellow spots over an olive green back. Its sides can have orange or red spots bordered by pale blue. They are often found in clean, cool, well-oxygenated streams and lakes, and are most active around dawn and dusk. Brook trout feed on nymphs, ants, beetles, small fish, and whatever they can find.

It is very important to protect brook trout. Wild trout management programs Eastern Brook Trout Joint Venture (EBTJV) are important state efforts taken for brook
