The chemical display is a representation of a mother's protection. The abstract red shows guarding, or how she watches over them. In the form you can see tall feathers that slowly morph into dark lines. This represents how the mother is maternalistic in terms of making the nest and bringing food (after the egg hatch, of course). The black lines are the abstract ideas in which the mother provides her time, sacrifice, and care. All of this involving her egg is the spectrum of what makes her a mother to provide and guard her egg with. The red watercolor does not represent blood - it represents the mother's promise. The burnt red markings are showing into her egg to show they are her egg and her responsibility and how she wants to protect them, as new-born children are known to be aggressive when defending their youth.
