This breeding bird can be mostly found on the western side of the U.S., where they breed usually in the spring. Their population also extends into parts of Mexico and Central America, but an irregularly cold climate is rare birds there.

This type of exchange serves as the main reason why the Prairie Warbler is endangered in addition to habitat destruction. Many of the warblers are captured, which puts much pressure on their population. As the human population also develops, they need less and more natural wildlife for cultivation, agriculture, and development, which eventually may lead to the endangerment of birds like them. On top of all of these dangers, the warblers are also very dependent on predators, especially in their nesting period.
