



The eye is white and below the eye is black. The penins are slightly paler than the males.

Habitat

These birds live in woods with oak, pine, agaves, agavea, and palm trees.

Diet

They eat insects like caterpillars, berries, and flying insects, but their diet also consists of nectar and berries.

Rearing

The penins commonly construct the nest, and some are made in Spanish moss and are covered with grass and feathers. When not in Spanish moss, the nest is made with grass, bark, and other materials. They have about 2-5 eggs, which are slightly green with spots. It takes around 12-13 days to hatch. The hatchlings are featherless with their eyes closed.

Behavior

To find food, they mostly move around branches, using their beaks to collect food. Also, they may hover in the air to catch flying insects. During
