

in forests and feeds of insects like: beetles, caterpillars, flies and leaf insects. They climb up branches and tops of canopies and probe into crevices, pine cones, and hollows of pine needles to attract insects.

The yellow-bellied warbler usually nests on top of canopies. These birds usually nest near the edge of branches. Though many nests are made up of Spanish Moss which is a epiphytic flowering plant which grows upon large trees in tropical forests. If there are no Spanish moss for the birds, the females weave together strips of bark, grasses and many types of weed stems to make nests.

These birds egg range from about 0.4-0.7in in length and 0.5-0.6in in width. The eggs are pale green with speckles and white line about 5-10 microns. Many particles throughout with a...
