

## Yellow-Throated Warblers

There are three main genera to which a yellow-throated warbler belongs: the warblers seen in the forest (Chlorophaga warblers), yellow-breasted warblers and those in subfamily "Vireonitarsus" warblers (less a few "larks").

Today, however, many of the yellow-throated warblers might have greenish wings and blue-yellow underparts to their regular yellow. Because of yellow wings through many of these, the yellow-throated warblers sometimes feeding close to the forest under.

Yellow-throated warblers have only in the east side of the continent. These warblers live in many different parts of

woods, including wetlands, mangroves, forests, wetlands, scrublands, grasslands, parks, etc. These warblers are in the family of wood warblers. These birds are good because they are good bird feeding birds.

Yellow-throated warblers are interesting and beautiful birds. They are very common through the continent in a wide variety of habitats and are not as common as the rest.
